

Music at St. Stephen

One of the opportunities our parish offers is ministry through music. There are five singing choirs and two handbell guilds whose primary goals are to provide musical leadership in the worship services and to instill in the participants an appreciation of the musical heritage of the Church.

Through a planned system of graded choirs, we seek to teach the importance of music in the Christian worship service. Choir members are trained in the liturgy of this parish church. They become familiar with the enduring hymns of the Church and they learn ecclesiastical choral and instrumental music. The Minister of Music also instructs these groups on the extensive symbolic portrayals of Christian history and doctrine found throughout St. Stephen.

For children, youth, and adults without a musical background, the ministry of music provides instruction in the general rudiments of music through the various choral and instrumental groups. This includes the recognition and comprehension of musical signs and symbols, a basic understanding of time and rhythm, and the fundamentals of music theory.

We feel that the knowledge gained through awareness of our church music heritage enhances our worship and gives us a medium of expression to understand, to enjoy, and to share throughout our lives.

The Sanctuary Choir has no paid singers; instead, we depend on persons who wish to dedicate and offer their time and talents to Almighty God through their service in the music ministry of this parish church. There is a place in the music program for anyone who wishes to learn, to grow, and to serve.

The Children, Youth, and Handbell Choirs rehearse from September to May with a break of about two weeks from mid-December to early January. The Sanctuary Choir rehearses and sings year-round with the exception of two weeks in August.

The Sanctuary Organ

In December of 1993, the organ underwent a major restoration/rebuilding by Garland Pipe Organs, Inc. of Fort Worth (Dan Garland, *owner/tonal director*). Originally, this instrument was installed in 1971 by the M. P. Möller Organ company. The organ consists of 4 manuals, 6 divisions, 77 ranks of pipes, and 4,485 individual pipes. A brochure is available describing the organ in detail.

The Sanctuary Piano

In June of 2008, a very generous gift was made to St. Stephen Presbyterian Church of a Bösendorfer Concert Grand Piano, for the church Sanctuary. The Bösendorfer company was founded in 1828 by Ignaz Bösendorfer, and is located in Vienna, Austria. Model 290, nicknamed, "Imperial," is the largest piano manufactured today with a full 8 octave range (97 notes). This instrument was presented to the church in honor of all parents and in gratitude for the Music Ministry of St. Stephen Presbyterian Church.

The Tower Bells

A peal of five bells sits on top of the Tower. The casting was completed in 1981 and the bells were installed in 1982. Cast by Eijsbouts, Ltd., Bell Founders in Asten, Holland, the bells range in weight from 1,000 pounds to almost 5,000 pounds. The combined weight of the peal is 12,081 pounds. The musical pitches of the bells are "C" (bourdon bell), "D#," "F," "G," and "A," which make possible a traditional Westminster hour strike or a Te Deum melody. During September and October of 2007 the operating systems of the bells underwent a complete renovation by the Verdin Company of Cincinnati, Ohio.

The St. Stephen Labyrinths

The canvas labyrinth is a replica of the famous one in the Cathedral of Notre Dame in Chartres, France. Carol Stalcup is the chairperson of the St. Stephen Labyrinth Docent Guild and is also a Veriditas-Trained Labyrinth Facilitator. The use of the Labyrinth is scheduled through Dr. Stalcup.

There is also a permanent outdoor Labyrinth on the east side of the sanctuary building overlooking downtown Fort Worth. This Labyrinth is available at any time and open to the public. A large, blue granite, Celtic Cross was commissioned for this space and stands in the northwest corner, serving as a centering point for walking this labyrinth. The cross is a gift from a St. Stephen family and is dedicated to the glory of God.
